This is in reference with the weather bulletin of the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical, Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) dated December 13, 2021 at 11:00 AM, that the Tropical Depression is forecasted to move general west northwestward and will likely to enter the Philippines Area of Responsibility (PAR) region as a **severe tropical storm** on Tuesday, December 14, 2021, evening. Once inside PAR, the domestic name "ODETTE" will be assigned to this tropical cyclone. Further, center of Tropical Cyclone (TC) Odette was estimated based on all available data will continue its west northwestward movement until Wednesday, December 15, 2021, morning. Afterwards, TC Odette will turn Westward with maximum sustained winds of 55 km/hour near the center, gustiness of up to 70 km/hour and will have an estimated peak intensity of around 150 km/hour may be reached prior to landfall. The combined effects of TC Odette and Tail-End of a Frontal System (Shear Line) will bring strong to at times heavy rains that may cause coastal inundation, storm surge, flash floods or landslides on location of Eastern Visayas, and whole of **Caraga Region**.

Relative thereto, please be advised to prepare, in any circumstance, the landfall of TC Odette and conduct regular monitoring over areas that are prone to flooding and landslide occurrences in your respective area and institute precautionary measures to deter further damage and prevent loss of lives and properties. Likewise, may we be updated of the status or possible impacts of TC Odette on your structures and the communities within your area of jurisdiction and the actions taken by the company to minimize its effect.
